The current document's validity ends when the holder of the document dies. In other words, an expired document cannot be issued as an official identity document. However, there are exceptions. Firstly, if the document holder dies while abroad, he can get a new document in his homeland. Secondly, in cases of emergency when the original document has been destroyed, he can get a new document in the country in which he is living. Document holders are allowed to get a new identity document or renew the original one. However, some of them become reluctant to do so, due to the following reasons: In case of renewal of the original document, the cost of renewal may be up to 100% of the value of the original document. The renewal of documents may take a long time. If the original document is destroyed and the holder is trying to renew it, there is a risk that the holder's new documents are rejected. In addition, in case of renewal, the holder's new identity is given as a citizen of that country. This is problematic if he wants to work in other countries, or travel abroad, for example, in order to seek employment. Being a citizen of the country in which the holder is currently living gives him the right to get a passport. This right can be transferred to the children of the holder. If a holder has the right to obtain a passport, the identity card he has is not
