mdorazio Based on the same idea, I've seen a small program with similar outcomes in Pittsburgh, PA [1]. While the first set of data shows an immediate drop in parking space when the program was implemented, looking more recently it's encouraging to see declines in parking occupancy. I work in the city's data center and use the cityprovided transit cards and ride the light rail system just to get from my office in downtown to the Data Center (in a suburb 2 miles away). It's crazy expensive and adds zero value in a lot of cases, but I suppose at
